# **OCTOBER BIRTHSTONE - OPAL**

If October is the month of your birth the theme is of colour and lots of it. Australia's own opal is truly a unique gemstone with its ever – changing array of colour meaning each one is different. The alternative stone this month is Tourmaline.

Chemistry SiO2 . nH2O

Crystal system: An amorphous mineraloid comprised of hydrated silicon dioxide. It is composed of an aggregate of tiny silica spheres arranged in regular patterns, that is a solidified gel.

Refractive index 1.44 – 1.47

Hardness 5.5 – 6.5

Specific gravity 1.99 – 2.25

Opals stand in a class by themselves. More than any other gem, each opal is distinctly an individual and is often placed in a protective setting like a bezel because of the softness of the stone.

The body colour of opal ranges from colourless, white, light gray through to dark gray and black. However the truly unique thing about opal is that it displays all the colours of the spectrum in a "play of colour" caused by diffraction of light passing through the silica spheres in its microstructure

Opal has water in its chemical composition and the content varies greatly and if stored under extremely dry (dehumidified) atmosphere, damage(surface crazing) may result due to the loss of moisture from the stone structure.

Australia is the predominant source of precious opal supplying around 95% of the world supply. The important opal mining areas of Australia include Lightening Ridge, Cooper Pedy, and Andamooka and many small miners do the mining predominantly.

It is believed the fantastic colour play of opal reflects our changing emotions and moods. Opal is professed to help the wearer find true and real love and is the anniversary gift for the 13<sup>th</sup> year of marriage.

#### TOURMALINE

Is associated with the zodiac sign of Libra and legend says tourmaline inspires artistic expression, enhanced intuition, increased self confidence and amplify one's psychic energies.

Chemistry:

Crystal system: Hexagonal (trigonal) Crystals common, usually found as prismatic crystals, often with vertical striated along the prism faces.

Refractive index 1.603 – 1.655

Hardness 7 – 7.5

Specific gravity 2.84 – 3.10

Tourmaline is truly a fascinating gemstone. Tourmaline is a very complex group of minerals but may be described as a complex aluminum borosilicate where colour is caused by presence or absence of various metal ions (Fe, Mn, Cr, V, Ti, and Cu) in the crystal structure.

Tourmaline can have fantastic colour, strong dichroism and sometimes unstable crystal structure means that can be quite challenging for the gem cutter. Cutting orientation is very important so that the facetted gem displays the best colour possible.
